

The Creative Vitality™ Suite is an online creative sector data tool designed for arts agencies and economic development offices. CVSuite's data can be used to document the economic impact of the creative sector at the regional, state, and local levels.

The CVSuite aggregates the most current, cleaned, and vetted data from national sources. Our creative economy data includes the number of jobs, earnings, revenues, wages, the concentration of jobs, and cultural nonprofit revenues. The tool also contains race, ethnicity, and age demographic data for all geographic areas.

Providing the creative community with data to demonstrate economic **impact.**

To support a variety of research, users of the CVSuite can select regions or build custom regions, and conduct a variety of exploratory and comparative analyses. The results are quantifiable and accessible through downloadable reports and spreadsheets. Research centered on CVSuite data has been effective and has supported requests for arts funding, brought value to art and economic development partnerships, and measured the impacts of cultural development initiatives.



Creative Vitality Suite (CVSuite)

Updated annually. Can measure trends longitudinaly at the state, MSA, county, and ZIP Code level.

NEA / BEA

Updated annually. Can measure trends longitudinally only at the state and national levels.

Arts & Economic Prosperity (AEP)

Updated every five years. Comparison between studies is limited because data sources may change.

DataArts

Updated annually. Trends available at the organization level. Comparisons limited to entities that opt in.
